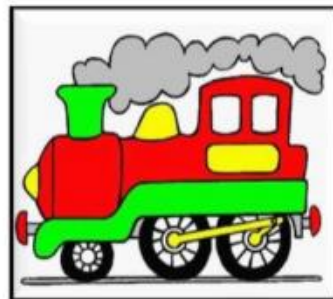
*Listen to the Jolly Phonics song,*
