Symptoms and testing for COVID-19

In these worrying times, we ask that parents are vigilant in looking out for signs of illness. Public Health England recommend that people should seek a test if:

- 1) they develop one or more of the main coronavirus symptoms: a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or the loss or change of their sense of taste or smell;
- 2) they are recommended to get tested by a healthcare provider (e.g. GP or nurse). If a child develops one or more of the main coronavirus symptoms described above, only they should be tested. There is no need for their households to have a test, unless they are also symptomatic.

We ask that you keep your child at home if they display any of these symptoms, however minor they may seem.



What happens at school

If a child is in school and begins to display any symptoms of COVID, they will immediately be taken to our Quarantine Area. A member of staff will stay with them but will wear full PPE. You will be contacted by phone and we ask that you make arrangements to collect your child immediately.

Your child should then self isolate at home for 10 days. You will be required to arrange a COVID test for your child. Household contacts should self isolate for 14 days unless the test is found to be negative. If negative, please share this result with us and your child can return to school. If your child's test is positive, you must inform school immediately. We will then notify Public

Health England Health Protection Team and the Local Authority who will advise us on our next steps as a school. This may include us closing a class or year group pod.

Home Learning

If a child, class or year group has to stay at home due to COVID, our staff have worked hard to be ready to provide Home Learning instantly. You will be emailed with details of work for the week which mirrors the learning that is taking place in class. This is more detailed than the Home Learning topics that we provided during Lockdown and is designed to ensure your child keeps up with the planned learning that should be taking place at school. It is essential that we have an up to date email address for you. Please contact the School Office if you need to update your details.

Rainbow Club

Don't forget that we now offer an extended school day meaning you can drop your child off with us at 7.30am and we can care for them until our new finish time of 6.00pm. Breakfast Club runs from 7.30 until the start of school for £4 Rainbow which includes breakfast for children who arrive before 8.00am



Our after school club is called **Rainbow Club** and opens from the end of school until 6.00pm Monday to Friday for £8 per session. Children are offered a range of fun activities and will be offered a snack and a drink.

Children can attend any number of sessions on any days but these must be booked in advance. In order to meet government guidelines, these children will remain in year groups and will not mix with other year groups or siblings.
