Communication

Communication is even more important than ever at the moment. We are missing being able to speak face to face with parents at pick up and drop off times. regularly as almost all of our communication is through email. This may include information in the future about a pod closure or home learning.

Parents' Evening

It is almost time for our Parents' Evening Meetings. We are unable to have these in school due to the current restrictions so this year the meeting will be a telephone call appointment instead of a face to face meeting. We would like to invite you to book an appointment in the same way as usual, via the eSchools app.

If you do not have the free app, please download it and then contact the School Office who will provide you with your login details.

Please note that due to limited phone lines in school, the appointments for each class are spread over two weeks and at varying times for each class teacher.



The Parents' evening appointment system goes live on the app on Friday 2nd October. Parents evening appointments are at various times during the last two weeks of this half term from Monday 12th October to Thursday 22nd October.

School Photographer

Our photographer will be in school on Wednesday 14th October.

After careful consideration we are delighted that we can still have individual school photographs taken this year. We do need to make a few changes though to ensure that the process follows our rigorous risk assessments.



We will not be able to offer family photographs or pictures with siblings in school as this compromises our Pod system. All photographs will be of individual children only.

We have worked hard to find a solution which reduces the costs for you but still provides you with a high quality picture of your child. The options of packs to buy is simpler, there are no cardboard frames or keyrings for example, but we are sure you will be delighted with the excellent photographs.

Home Learning

If a child, class or year group has to stay at home due to COVID, our staff have worked hard to be ready to provide Home Learning instantly. You will be emailed with details of work for the week which mirrors the learning that is taking place in class. This is more detailed than the Home Learning topics that we provided during Lockdown and is designed to ensure your child keeps up with the planned learning that should be taking place at school. Parking

We are <u>very</u> concerned about the parking around school in a morning. There have been a number of near misses with children and we have had complaints from residents about driveways being blocked. Please take a few extra minutes to park sensibly and consider leaving your car a few minutes away and walking the last part of your journey. We have asked the Police and Council to support us but we need you to help us before someone gets injured.

Symptoms and testing for COVID-19

In these worrying times, we ask that parents are vigilant in looking out for signs of illness. Public Health England recommend that people should seek a test if:

- 1) they develop one or more of the main coronavirus symptoms: a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or the loss or change of their sense of taste or smell;
- 2) they are recommended to get tested by a healthcare provider (e.g. GP or nurse). If a child develops one or more of the main coronavirus symptoms described above, only they should be tested. There is no need for their households to have a test, unless they are also symptomatic.

We ask that you keep your child at home if they display any of these symptoms, however minor they may seem.



What happens at school

If a child is in school and begins to display any symptoms of COVID, they will immediately be taken to our Quarantine Area. A member of staff will stay with them but will wear full PPE. You will be contacted by phone and we ask that you make arrangements to collect your child immediately.

Your child should then self isolate at home for 10 days. You will be required to arrange a COVID test for your child. Household contacts should self isolate for 14 days unless the test is found to be negative. If negative, please share this result with us and your child can return to school.

If your child's test is positive, you must inform school immediately. We will then notify Public Health England Health Protection Team and the Local Authority who will advise us on our next steps as a school. This may include us closing a class or year group pod.

If you or a member of your household are displaying symptoms, please arrange for a test immediately. https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/antigen/name

Contacting School

We do realise that it is not as easy to communicate with class teachers at the start and end of the day at the moment. Do feel that you can give us a ring, or send an email, if you have any concerns or questions.
