Academic Year 2016-2017 (With Impact Statement September 2016)

Key Priority

Provide support to our Pupil Premium children and their families in order to minimise the disadvantage gap of pupils from low income families and support/raise attainment of these pupils

Summary of actions:

- Implement interventions in all year groups to close the attainment gap between PP children and non PP children
- Improve levels of progress for PP children to match non-PP children
- Provide quality pastoral care to PP children and their families
- Provide a breakfast club for all PP children
- Learning Mentor support to improve attendance of PP children
- Provide financial support for families through uniform vouchers and payment for trips
- Enhance life experiences by providing access to after school clubs and holiday clubs

2016/2017 Action Plan

The government has allocated a specific pupil premium grant to every school. Qualifying students in 2015/2016 resulted in a predicted grant of £81,000 for this academic year.

Successful initiatives t	hroughout 2015-2016 include:	
Learning Mentor	Worked closely with PP and vulnerable pupils and their families to provide support and links to outside agencies. Monitors attendance and impacts positively on persistent absences by working with the families to overcome barriers to getting their child to school. Provides support in school to pupils in terms of bereavement support, behavioural problems, self-esteem, confidence, child protection, friendship issues, social skills etc	£24,762
Teaching Assistants/HLTA/NN to implement interventions	Expanded our team of Teaching Assistants to ensure all classes had a TA. They were able to deliver pastoral support to any vulnerable pupils on a daily basis. They also delivered interventions and small group support for those pupils who required extra help.	£33479.95
Curriculum enrichment, School visits & Residentials for current FSM	The decision was taken last year to no longer cover the cost of trips for all PP children. School did however support families who approached us for help.	£218
School Uniform	Uniform vouchers are provided for PP families who request them.	£480
Breakfast Club	Offered to all PP children and vulnerable children. Attended by 51% of PP children on a regular basis. This is an increase on last year's 40%. This provides pupils with a healthy breakfast before school as well as positively impacting on pupil's punctuality and attendance. The Learning Mentor uses this time to make contact with each PP child who attends and provides a quiet opportunity to talk to parents. This Summer we invested in a new kitchen for the Breakfast Club so we could offer a warm, cooked breakfast.	£16,243.80
